'In July the sun is hot. Is it shining? No, it's not!

These words are from a 'Flanders and Swann song' talking about the weather each month. July is a month of holidays for many people. Children start their long summer break and, as far as the U.K. Is concerned, the big topic of conversation is usually the weather!

I am reminded that our sons always asked, 'Is it going to be fine for our holidays?' Obviously, I couldn't answer in the affirmative, but we always seemed to enjoy it anyway. Irrespective of the weather, how do we spend our holiday?

It seems an ideal time for prayer about our future and the needs of others.

A long time ago I was taught a different way of praying which wasn't to pray for people by name but, instead, to wrap them in an outer layer, like a parcel, and offer it to God because He knows the needs of each person and will respond as He thinks is right.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank people for their prayers, concern, prayer cards, messages and phone calls following my possible stroke and the 4 days I spent in Bangor Hospital.

I had to go there instead of Bronglais because the relevant machine they needed to use had broken down! After a journey of almost 2 hours, I waited outside in the ambulance for 4 hours!

Nigel had phoned the Chaplain there - who we have known for a long time - to say that I was on my way and he came and sat with me in the ambulance for a long time and he paid me regular visits on the ward during the 4 days I was in hospital.

When you are about 70 miles from home in hospital, to see someone you know is very comforting and important.

It also reminded me that it is very important to keep in touch with our family and friends, especially those whom we don't see very often.

Llanfihangel-y-Pennant Quite Days at St Michael's Church



In addition to the usual Celtic Evening Prayer services every Friday in July and August, this year we will be running two Quiet Days in St Michael's, on 25th July and 22nd August. These will be a gently led days, away from everyday distractions of mobile phones and social media, for us to enjoy the beautiful St Michael's church, long associated with Mary Jones, and its stunning surroundings. A time of rest and spiritual refreshment.

The Quiet Days will commence with a brief Celtic Morning Prayer at 11 am. A meditation will follow with a focus on the local landscape as it might have been when Mary Jones was a child, to prepare us for a period of quiet. After lunch there will be a second meditation and a quiet mini-pilgrimage across the valley to Ty'n y Ddol, the remains of the house where Mary Jones grew up. The day will conclude with the usual Celtic Evening Prayer at 3 pm at which we hope to be joined by those who wish to come to just that service.

A few practical details: Please bring cushions and picnic chairs to ensure you are comfortable in the church and churchyard. Also, please bring your own refreshments and a picnic lunch.
