No need to wait

There are many kinds of waiting. Some waiting is a time of busy preparation, like those waiting for a wedding, the birth of a baby, a special party, or indeed Christmas. However, some waiting, such as for the results of a job interview, university application, or medical tests, can press the pause button on life, making it difficult to focus and get on with our normal routines, let alone cope with anything different or special. Waiting can be loud and frantic, or calm and quiet. It can allow for reflection and insight, or it can be full of trepidation and fear. Yet it is something all of us do in different ways every day.

Advent is a season of waiting. The name comes from the Latin *adventus* meaning ‘coming/arrival’. It anticipates the ‘coming of Christ’: in our Christmas celebrations of Jesus’ birth in Bethlehem, in the hearts of those who believe in Jesus, and in the return of Christ in the future.

Our passage through this time of waiting is marked by the lighting of the Advent wreath candles each Sunday and the daily opening of the Advent calendar (with chocolates for some!), in addition to all the shopping, cooking, present wrapping, and singing of carols! Throughout it all, if we take the time to listen, we hear the ever-increasing voices of the prophets of old, of Zechariah and Elizabeth, of the angel Gabriel and Mary, all proclaiming that God is sending the one who will bring an end to everyone’s waiting! Then the loud crescendo as the angels appear to the shepherds singing ‘Glory to God in the highest heaven’ and saying, ‘**Today** in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord.’

This is the good news of comfort and joy that Christmas brings.  
We no longer need to wait!

Jesus is named Emmanuel, meaning ‘God is with us’ – now, today. He offers forgiveness, healing, wholeness, and peace to all those who seek it. In his coming and being born as one of us, and living among us, he has shown us how to live in a way that means that no one should have to wait in fear or trepidation because of the situation they are in or are facing. In the midst of the darkness, he offers light and life.

So why do we have the season of Advent? To remind us that many people in the world today are still waiting for light and hope in their darkness. We need to be sharing that good news of comfort and joy in our actions and our prayers, helping and supporting those across the world waiting for love, kindness, care, and peace in their lives. There is no need for us to wait until Christmas to do that!

May you enjoy sharing the love of God and the peace of Christ with all those you encounter in your journey through Advent.

# But what of the Future?

Sue and Roger Whitehouse's daughter, Liz, is in effect the Vicar of five of the churches in the centre of York apart from a big Anglican Evangelical church and the Minster. She is also a Canon of the Minster now.

The Archbishop of York (Stephen Cottrell) is very much an evangelist. Before he became a bishop he was the Diocesan Missioner in Wakefield diocese and in 2006, when he had just been made the Area Bishop of Reading, he wrote a book called 'From the Abundance of the Heart – Catholic Evangelism for all Christians' which I have recently been reading again. In the Introduction to the book he wrote:-

*'Evangelism is that aspect of mission which brings people to faith in Christ. It is the process whereby people become disciples of Christ.'*

He says that the New Testament uses the Greek word *mysterion* to describe the Gospel of Christ. Hence Anglo Catholics use the words 'the Holy Mysteries' to describe the Eucharist because their evangelism has always been rooted in the very practical social action and the beauty of worship that would draw people to the presence of God. That was certainly the strategy of that great generation of priests who planted and built churches in Victorian England and Wales and for whom 'presence and proclamation' went 'hand in hand.'

Archbishop Stephen says in his book that he well remembers visiting a church in a very wealthy part of England to speak about evangelism and someone said to him 'We don't need to worry about evangelism here – our church is full on Sundays and we pay our quota (parish share)!'

If our motivation for evangelism is simply filling the pews and paying our 'parish share' we won't get very far with spreading the Gospel! Of

course, we would all like our churches to be full but they are not meant to be ‘private worship clubs!’ Everyone, rich or poor, can have a relationship with God.

Archbishop Stephen also says ‘Evangelism is about people. For ‘bums on seats’ read ‘hands ready to serve, ears to listen, hearts to love and minds shaped by the will and purpose of God. Without people there will be no mission. We want the Church to grow, not because we are concerned with building the earthly empire of the Church, but because we want to build God’s Kingdom in the world.’

I fully appreciate that rural ministry is different to ministry in large cities and in big ‘Council estates’ such as those where Celia and I served our curacies, but the message of the Good News is unchanging. It is the same yesterday, today and forever. It is the way we ‘put it over’ and make it relevant to people in 2024 and beyond that we have to think about now.

I still remember the words of a lady some years ago at a Deanery meeting, when I was Area Dean. We were discussing the future of the churches and what should be done about the falling numbers attending our churches and she said ‘I’m not worried about the future, my church will see me out!’

If everyone in our churches thinks like she did, her views will be self-fulfilling! That should be a frightening thought to all of us who hope that the Church will be here for our grandchildren and great grandchildren when they grow up. The big unanswered question is ‘**What are we going to do about it?**’

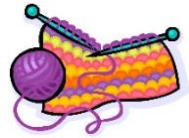

## **Hansford Family Update**

Another Christmas approaches and we give thanks for the past year, the gift of time together, and the prayers, support, understanding and patience of so many people as we negotiate an ever-changing pattern of life. Since Paul's MRI scan on October 15<sup>th</sup>, he has struggled with increasing mobility and cognitive issues (although he's still able to keep the 'dementia actif' group laughing!). A fall down the bottom few stairs at home required a trip to A&E due to a bleeding head and resulted in his next MRI being pulled forward to November 26<sup>th</sup> (results on Dec 2<sup>nd</sup>). ### **Introducing . . . IDRIS!**

'Idris' is the name of the cashless donation scheme currently being developed for the churches of Bro Ystumanner. It is also the name of the card machine being piloted in St Cadfan's.

During last Summer it became evident that visitors now expect to find a cashless donation facility in the churches and cathedrals they visit.

Idris in St Cadfan's is a Payaz Giving Station 3, which we purchased through Parish Buying. It consists of a tablet computer and a SumUp card payment machine securely mounted in a substantial and attractive casing suitable for unattended operation. The casing can be secured to a strong point in the building (in our case a large central heating pipe) with a wire cable and lock.

We selected the Giving Station because the tablet screen and the Give a Little software offers the visitor a choice of ‘campaigns’ to donate to, currently General Donations and the Vestry Floor Appeal (both with Gift Aid enabled) plus a separate campaign for Sales for which Gift Aid is not applicable. All options offer an email receipt facility and give a ‘Thank You for your Donation’ sign-off message. The Give-a-Little App enables us to continually monitor donations. For a Giving Station to work in a church the following are necessary:



- Sufficient visitor numbers to warrant the £500 investment.
- In the absence of Wifi a mobile phone signal with a minimum strength of about 2 bars of 4G. St Cadfan’s system uses a SIM card which searches for the optimum mobile signal. The running cost of the SIM is about £1 per week.
- At least one person within the congregation who is sufficiently tech-savvy to take on the maintenance of their system after suitable training. Paul will help with the setting up process (it’s a long and steep learning curve, believe me!).

It will be the decision of individual congregations whether they go for a Giving Station. However, if you are beginning to think this isn’t for your church then don’t despair. The scope of the Idris project is to support all our churches. To that end we are applying to the Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) so that we can set up a dedicated donation button facility for each individual church page within the Bro Ystumanner website, as well as the Ministry Area as a whole. (This again is a process which has taken a long time.) CAF will process donation button payments and credit the Bro Ystumanner Charity bank account for a small percentage fee. To limit the administrative effort the plan is to distribute the donated money to each church quarterly.



So, the next question is: How do we get people to look at the website? We plan to provide each church with an A4 display stand complete with a dedicated QR code which will take visitors to the individual church's web page where they will find the Donation Button. Even if there is no signal, their phones will create the link which will become live when they again have signal. For people apprehensive about using QR codes there are alternative simple instructions on how to get to the church web page. It is anticipated that visitors and people attending large church events (e.g. weddings and funerals) who may not have cash available will appreciate the availability of cashless giving.

The first Giving Station (Idris) machine is now live and collecting donations in St Cadfan's. If anyone would like a demonstration in their own church (provided they have some mobile signal) please get in touch. We will test the Donation Button system first in Llangelynnin Old Church and Llanfihangel y Pennant, and hope to have it available to all churches before the Christmas holiday period. I would like to thank Roger Whitehouse and Rev Ruth for their support and encouragement with this project, and Rev George who found out that the Charities Aid Foundation offer the Donation Button facility for a very reasonable fee.
