Thoughts for Holy Week and April ***Rev Steve Rollins***

As I write we've just celebrated Mothering Sunday, Sul y Fam, Lent 4 as Laetare Sunday, when, among other things, we rejoice at the refreshment it gives us during the long forty days of Lent, perhaps with a simnel cake and a glass of something. Ahead of us still lie Passiontide, Palm Sunday, Sul y Blodau, and Holy Week, y Wythnos Fawr, culminating in the Easter Triduum: Maundy Thursday, Go(o)d Friday and Holy Saturday, and then the Joy of the Resurrection on the Easter Day!

I thought I could do worse for the beginning of April than to share with you this month a poem translated by the poet from its original Welsh:

Palm Sunday

(Translation of Gweddi ar Sul Y Blodau) - Ruth Roberts Owen

The mule moved slowly beneath You,
her flesh, her bone and her muscle carrying
Your flesh, Your bones and Your muscle,
for you were made Man
with a body like ours.

Reaching the outskirts of town, adulation
exploded around You
rained like blows on Your body and head
for You knew what was prophesied...

Palm leaves scourged You till bloody,
words of false praise spat in Your innocent face;
hard kisses would hammer the nails that would pierce You -
Your side would be stabbed by their absolute blindness to Grace.
Was Your heart not riven, sweet Lord, by their raving?

They shouted, 'Hosanna!'
but You, as their God, knew the lie
Take Him and bind Him and break Him and mock Him
nail him to His Cross:
raise him up -
Crucified.

To me this sums up our experience through winter and early Spring: a terrible beauty is born as we look around us in our fields and gardens. Gradually, this gives way to the Easter season, the Resurrection, Ascension and Return of the Messiah, the Christ as we say (the bits of our Lenten Study course on the texts of Handel's masterpiece that we didn't study!).

One of these green shoots of recovery is the return to us of our Vicar

Ruth, as she begins to take services for us again this month of April. Like Chaucer's pilgrims to Canterbury:

Whan that Aprille with his shoures soote,
The droghte of March hath perced to the roote
Thanne longen folk to goon on pilgrimages

Ruth's pilgrimage has been through the drought and now we pray that she will enjoy the sweet showers of renewal she has longed for this April, as will we all. Amen.

1. Independent Governance Review - March 2026 Diocese of Bangor

By now most people are aware that there have been some serious issues with governance and leadership in the Diocese of Bangor and Bangor Cathedral. These are now being addressed. As part of the process, an Independent Governance Review was commissioned to review what had happened, identify the issues, and make recommendations as to how to go forward with more robust measures in place to ensure the best governance and leadership possible going forward.

It is good for us all to be aware of the issues, so we can pray knowledgeably for all those involved, and take an informed and active part ourselves in making our Church a place that proclaims good news in all it does and the way that it does it.

For those who would like a little bedtime reading (it is only 18 pages!), it can be found on the website of the Diocese of Bangor. Click on the Menu button (left-hand side), then scroll down to Library, then Diocesan documents, then Independent Governance Review. I have also printed off a paper copy, if people would prefer to borrow that.

2. Invitation to Meirionydd Archdeaconry Extraordinary Synod

(These are two emails to Rev. Ruth from the Archdeaconry of Meirionydd)

2a. Dear friends in the Archdeaconry of Meirionnydd,

Following the recent decision not to appoint an interim Bishop, and the confirmation that the Electoral College process to elect the next Bishop of Bangor will restart this month, we would like to invite you to an extraordinary meeting of Meirionnydd Synod. The purpose of the meeting will be to offer the clergy and laity of our archdeaconry the opportunity to discuss together what we hope to see in our next bishop.

Date: Saturday, 18 April, 2026 Time: 2.00pm

Location: St Mary's Church, Dolgellau.

2b. We, Canon Miriam, and the Reverend Rhun ap Iwan are among the 6 clergy, together with Susan Fogarty, Kevin Challinor, and Geraint Williams who are among the 6 lay electors on behalf of our diocese with the responsibility to elect our next bishop. As the five of us are from the

Archdeaconry of Meirionnydd, we have a strong voice on the Electoral College.

It is therefore extremely important that we hear your opinion as representatives of our people and our archdeaconry. We would especially like to hear your expectations, your concerns, and your hopes regarding what kind of Bishop you would like to see leading the Diocese of Bangor into the future. We ask you, therefore, to encourage all members of your Ministry Areas to attend. This meeting is an important opportunity for our archdeaconry to pray together, and to express its voice and vision. If anyone is unable to attend the meeting in Dolgellau, we would like to invite people to write to us by email if you have something you would like to contribute to our discussion. We believe it is important to give the opportunity to contribute, so that we can represent everyone's opinion in the process.

There will be plenty of panads available and we look forward to seeing you there.

School Pastors

The three Trustees have signed their documents and the next stage is to sign the Licence Agreement and send it back to Ascension Trust. We are truly blessed that School Pastors are ecumenical and the Churches in the area are supporting this venture. We have funds now to go ahead, but

we do require a secretary. This is not an onerous task as it would only involve one, possibly two meetings annually.

Once the Licence Agreement is signed and sent to Ascension Trust, the umbrella organisation, training can start. It is hoped that School Pastors will be operational in September.

Eco-Church.

Being told, at St. Cadfan's, that buying "green gas" through the Parish Buying scheme would increase our gas bill by around 20% is the sort of thing that concentrates the mind. In particular, it raises the question of what constitutes stewardship.. For many in positions of responsibility in churches, the word means two things: a call to regular and substantial giving by church members, and a determination to spend as little as possible of the church's money. Any increase in the second of these two items tends to be seen as irresponsible.

But what are we stewards of? In Genesis, God commands Mankind to "dominate the Earth and subdue it, as most translations have it. A subtle shade of meaning in the original Hebrew is thereby lost. The word translated subdue actually also implies husbanding and caring for. I would like to encourage all members of our Ministry Area to consider whether spending more of our churches' resources on things which cost more here-and-now might in fact be better stewardship on a wider scale.

Thy Kingdom Come!




Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.

Since it began in May 2016, God has grown TKC from a dream of possibility into a movement which unites more than a million Christians in prayer, in nearly 90% of countries worldwide, across 85 different denominations and traditions- so that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to faith in Jesus Christ. Every person, household and church are encouraged to pray during the 11 days in their own way. It is our hope & prayer, that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and His love for the world, will hear it for themselves and respond and follow Him. Specifically, we again invite each and every Christian across the globe to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of 5 people who have not responded with their Yes to God's call. Thy Kingdom Come is an initiative that occurs every year between Ascension Day and Pentecost, where people are asked to pray for 5 people to come to know Christ. Last year, the congregation and visitors of St Peter's, Aberdyfi, wrote the names of their 5 on pebbles and put them at the foot of the cross. These pebbles were then put into the sea on Pentecost Sunday. There are many ways of remembering the 5 - writing their names on leaves or hearts on a tree, stars on a piece of dark blue paper, petals on a flower, or just using a rosary, for example. 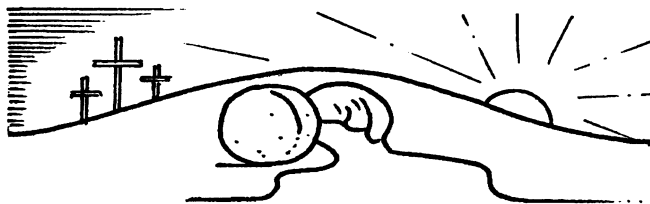
