The pilgrim way **Rev Steve Rollins**

As I write this on 17th March we are joining our Celtic cousins across the water and worldwide in celebrating their patron saint. Patricius, as he styled himself, befitting a Late Roman Briton - Padraig to the Irish, Padrig or Patrick to us – is known as the Apostle of Ireland. Born in what is now England, or Scotland, or even Wales, he is truly a British saint. The Irish connection is that he was captured by Irish pirates and enslaved there, escaped after six years, only to return there eventually as a Christian missionary. The story of his redemption, the colour green and the shamrock speak to us of Spring, celebration of Easter and beyond that to the Trinity.

We are still making our pilgrim way through Lent, entering Passiontide, Palm Sunday and Holy Week, culminating in the great Easter Triduum starting on the evening of Maundy Thursday, running through Good Friday into Holy Saturday and on to the Easter Vigil, the Dawn Service and Easter morning. Some or all of these will be offered in our churches and chapels across Bro Ystumanner and in open air services too. An innovation this year is the Maundy Thursday Watch of Prayer in the St Cadfan's glass room – open to all from 8:30pm. There are the United Good Friday processions in Aberdyfi and Tywyn, and Stations at Stations takes place on the Talyllyn railway later that day with an 'ecumenical' team, as it has done for some years now – this year, starting at 4pm and finishing mid evening led by Rev Phil Jump, North West Baptist Association Regional Minister. The Dawn service on Tywyn beach and promenade is also ecumenical, and most churches aim to have their own Easter Day service to greet the Risen Christ.

Part of our Lenten pilgrim progress has been the ecumenical Pilgrimage course – seven sessions held in Tywyn churches and chapels and this year actually finishing in Easter week (13th April in St Cadfan's). As I write we've just had the third session in the Baptist church and next week will be hosted by the Catholic Church in St Cadfan's. It has been so good to get together to explore each other's traditions and churchmanship. The last time we had anything similar was March 2020, when we were using materials based on the book of Jonah. You may remember that something happened (I don't know if there was a Jonah among us), and we had to abandon ship in the middle of the month. We never completed the course and we haven't really managed to get back together since.

So it's been doubly good to do exactly that, and I'm sure I'm not the only one who feels doubly blessed as a result of our pilgrimage to each other's churches. Our Good Friday broken bodies have been resurrected and we are once again Easter people. We have plans to celebrate this with the United Service on Tywyn Seafront at the end of July, followed by Worship on the Wharf at Aberdyfi on Sunday evenings in August. I feel sure St Patrick would have approved.

See you at some of these? I wish you a joyous and blessed Easter.

We have had a sizeable group (20 or more) from the different churches meeting together each week to explore the idea of pilgrimage, whether physical or spiritual (or both!), as a way of drawing us closer to God and to each other. It has been lovely to have different people leading the groups in a variety of ways, providing a very enriching experience for us all. We continue to meet, up to and after Easter, as detailed above. You do not need to have been to previous sessions, so newcomers are still welcome.

We are using the Lent course from Churches Together in Britain and Ireland originally published in 2016, which uses reflections and images from a variety of sources to encourage conversation, which they certainly have done. Copies of the reflections are provided at each session, but for those who would like their own copy, they are available in the form of a pack of booklets available in Welsh (£5.00) or English (£10.00) through the ctbi website (https://ctbi.org.uk/lent-2016/) (or ask Rev. Ruth to order you a pack). The booklets and resources can also be viewed on-line. Even if you are unable to join us for the Lent group, the reflections can be used by individuals to reflect on their own spiritual journey at any time.

Following the Maundy Thursday liturgy, many congregations hold a "Watch of Prayer". This Maundy Thursday, April 6th from 8.30pm, this will be happening in our Ministry Area, in St Cadfan's glass reading room. (It will be heated.) Other churches from the surrounding area have been invited too.

For some people, The Gethsemane Watch may seem daunting but it does present us with a superb opportunity to teach faithfulness in prayer and discipleship.

hour?" were the words of reproach from Jesus to his hapless followers in that first Gethsemane. Since then, disciples of subsequent generations have attempted to do better in some small way, to make up for what was lacking in the first bunch.

This isn't meant to be easy or routine. It is a time of conversation with God, a time to reflect with God, a time to remember...

A replacement heater fitted in the nave: During the last congregational meeting at St Peter's on 30th September 2022, it was reported that one of the church heaters had failed completely and the cost of a

replacement unit was quoted as £2200.

It was decided that this revised figure could not be covered from existing church funds and a proposal was put to the committee that a fund for the would be started to raise the necessary money for a replacement.

The members of the congregation rose to the challenge magnificently and by the end of the year had raised a total of £965.

A suggestion was made that the church could also apply for a grant from the Aberdyfi Advertising and Improvements Committee (AAIC) to help cover the shortfall.

A request to the AAIC resulted in a very generous grant of £1235 which meant that St Peter's had sufficient funds to order a replacement unit.

A new heater has now been fitted in the church that has been a godsend for the congregation over the last few weeks of cold winter weather.

The members of the St Peter's committee and the whole congregation would like to express their sincere gratitude to all those who helped raise the necessary money but particularly to the AAIC for their very generous and invaluable help with this project that has made the church very much more comfortable for everyone.

Obituary: The funeral of Frank Brian Willets Mole (Brian) who died on 30th January aged 90 was held on Wednesday 15th February at 11am. The service was attended by a large congregation and officiated by

Reverend Christina ten Wolde. Our prayers and condolences are with the family and friends of the deceased.

Brian was a much loved and respected member of the community who during his time in Aberdyfi was totally committed to help the village and its inhabitants. Over the years, Brian had been a councillor, church warden, school governor, and a dedicated member of the Aberdyfi Players. He was a true gentleman who spent his life helping and supporting the local community whenever he could. Brian was also a much valued member of St Peter's Church. He set up the services every week and organised the Remembrance Day services for many years.
